J. Walter Malone served as Millikin University's president from January 1946-April 1956. He had an A.B. 1909 from Western Reserve University, and a 1919 Bachelor of Divinity degree from McCormick seminary and studied at the University of Edinburgh, Scotland under a graduate fellowship 1920-1921. He established the McKinley Foundation through Senator William B. McKinley in Champaign and served as its director from 1928-1941. He then served as vice president of the McCormick Theological seminary in Chicago from 1941-1945. Malone led the fund raising campaign for Scovill Science Hall, and began initial planning for a men's dormitory (later called Mills Hall). In 1957 the Malone Chapel in what is now known as Shilling Hall was named in his honor. Malone lived in Clinton after retirement and served on the board of directors of its Fine Arts Center and the Warner Library. He died at age 74 on November 7, 1962.
